## Labor Mobility in Urban China:

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### What Does Labor Mobility Reflect?

- Job Changes Reflect both Decisions of Employers and Employees:
  - Employees moving to better opportunities
  - Employees moving as a result of lost jobs or failed self-owned enterprises
- Mobility Across Industry Sectors Reflects
  - Short-Term Labor Market Response to GFC
  - Longer-Term Structural Changes in Economy

- How Much Mobility is Toward More Secure Employment?
  - "Informal" to Formal Employment?
  - Employment without Contract to Employment with Contract?
- How Does Mobility Differ Across Men and Women?
- How Does Mobility Differ by Residential Registration Status?
- Mobility is Often Driven by Preferences and Abilities of Individuals and Households

### Conclusions and Next Steps in China

- Migrants are More Mobile?
  - Vulnerability / Short-term Nature of Employment Relationships
  - Importance of Relative Youth of Migrants
- Workers Falling into the "Informal" Category are More Mobile (not yet in identified probit model)
- Descriptive Evidence Suggests that Women are More Likely to Move Into Informal Sector, and if Leaving a Primary/Secondary Industry, are More Likely to Move Into Services
  - To What Extent is Women's Mobility Driven by Low Retirement Age? Once we control for age, gender difference in mobility disappears
- As Yet Unexamined: Entry from School into the Labor Force

## Our Paper in Light of the India Labor Mobility Paper

- Descriptive Probit Models of the Determinants of Mobility
- India Paper Examines Change of Job Since First Job. Data Driven. Not surprising that age is strongly associated with mobility as the observation window differs with age.
- Voluntary vs Involuntary Mobility and the China Team Agenda
  - Reports of Involuntary Moves are Quite Low
  - Mobility and Correlation with Labor Market Shocks?
  - Household Correlates with Mobility
  - Mobility, Gender and Mandatory Retirement Age
