POST-CRISIS DEVELOPMENT CONTEXT

- ☐ Economic recovery not matched by labour market recovery
- ☐ "Rebalancing" towards new sustainable development trajectory
 - ➤ Public sector consolidation and private-sector led growth
 - > Domestic-led instead of export-led growth
 - > Environmental sustainability and green jobs
 - > Regional integration and trade
- ☐ Impact and implications for informal enterprises and informal employment: some research issues

POST-CRISIS LABOUR MARKET CONTEXT

- ☐ Trends in Asia:
 - > Asia leading world in strong economic recovery
 - > But persistent high unemployment, vulnerable employment, working poverty, gender inequalities
 - > Employment growth in services not manufacturing
- ☐ Research Issues:
 - ➤ Lessons learned from crisis and tracking informal employment post-crisis
 - > Flexibilization and informalization in formal enterprises
 - ➤ Informal employment in services types and quality compared to manufacturing, agriculture
 - > New growth sectors and informality

PRIVATE-SECTOR, DOMESTIC-LED GROWTH

☐ Trends in Asia:

- > From fiscal stimulus to consolidation and privatesector led growth
- > Strengthening domestic investment and consumption, reducing reliance on exports
- > Expanding Asian middle class

□ Research Issues:

- ➤ Support for private investments: deregulation, support to SMEs
- ➤ Differential impact of domestic consumption versus exports on informal employment
- "Middle-class affluence": demand for personalized services including paid domestic help

GREEN JOBS

☐ Trends:

- > Setting economies along low-carbon, climate-resilient paths: adaptation and mitigation measures
- > Climate change finance mechanisms do not address informality or gender issues
- Changing patterns of production, consumption and employment

☐ Research Issues:

- > Job losses: who and where
- ➤ Green job opportunities in informal economy ensuring just transition for enterprises and workers
- Green jobs not necessarily decent jobs

REGIONAL INTEGRATION AND TRADE

☐ Trends in Asia:

- > Trade, investments, financial flows increasingly intra-Asian
- Regional integration: expanded markets but intensified competition, winners and losers
- > ASEAN Community by 2015 but free labour mobility only for business people and skilled labour

☐ Research Issues:

- > Effects of (sub)regional versus more global trade on informal employment
- ➤ Insertion/exclusion of informal workers in regional value chains
- > Implications for labour migration and the working poor
