Traditional Herbal Medicine Sector, China: Applying Value Chain Analysis

There are **three types of chains** in this sector:

- **International market chains**: international retailer series of middlemen large factories contractors subcontractors local factories cultivators
- **Domestic market chains**: retailers middlemen wholesale market contractors subcontractors factories- informal workshops cultivators
- Local market chains: retailers (local hospital pharmacies and chemist shops) wholesale market contractors subcontractors factories- informal workshops cultivators

Traditional Herbal Medicine Sector, China: Applying Value Chain Analysis

Main findings:

- Traditional herbal medicine sector:
 - Level of earnings: differs for different informal workers in different positions along the same chain
 - Impact of sector: main source of income for many households (especially in poor counties in western China) + reduces medical costs for whole communities
- Community-based organizations: important role in collecting market information + providing protection against natural disasters (e.g. against hail storms and drought)
- Government standards and regulations: helping informal workers improve their capacity to compete in the market
- New rural Cooperative Medical Care System (CMS): using traditional herbal medicines
- Value chain analysis: will contribute to building and improving the use of traditional medicines under the CMS

Note: CMS is the main health system for universalizing medical-care in rural China today

Future research:

- 1. Comparing the difference of the value chains of herbal medicine industry among more counties and different ethnical regions.
- 2. Analyzing the database and testing the findings in case studies.
- 3. Along the value chains to summarize what we can learn from the good experiences of informal employment in this industry.
- 4.Studying the connection between informal economy of herbal medicine industry and local medical-care market. (What could the informal economy of herbal industry do in controlling the medicine cost in poor regions.)
