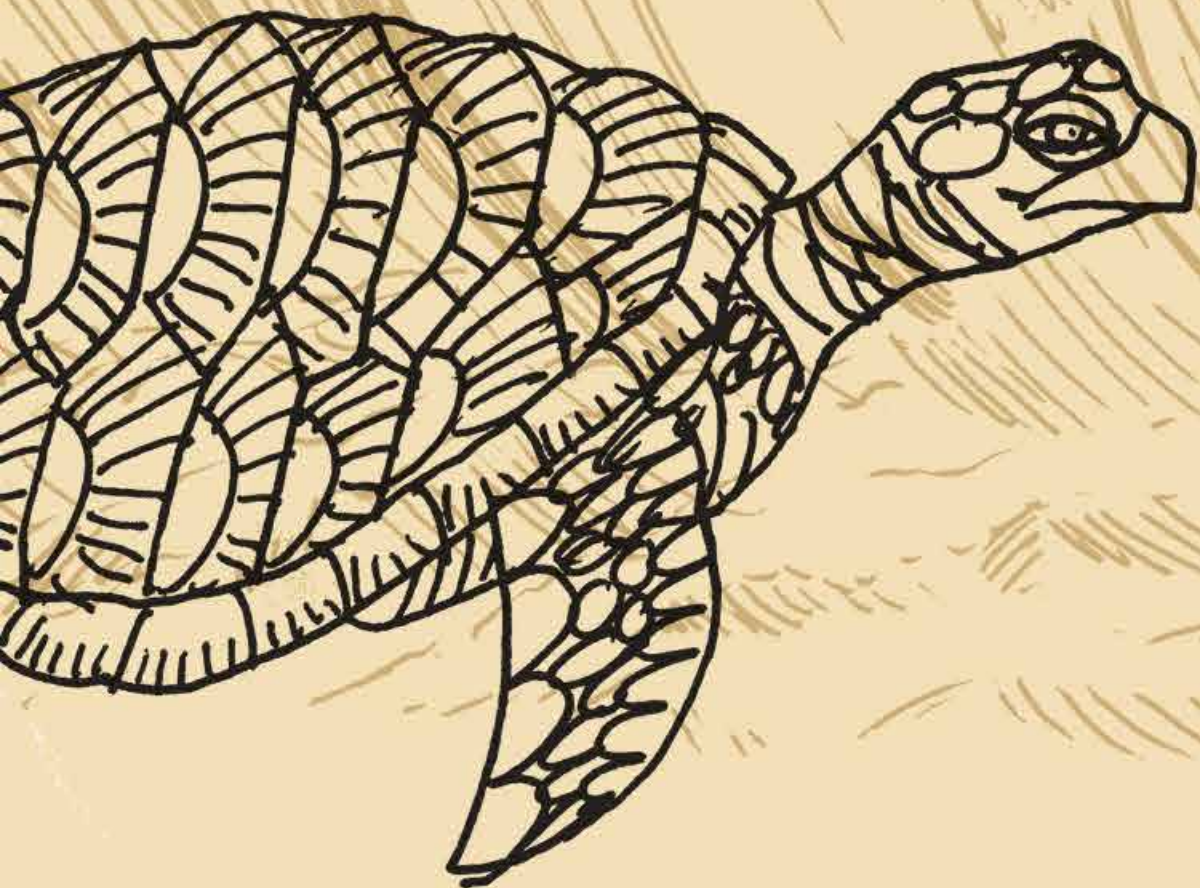

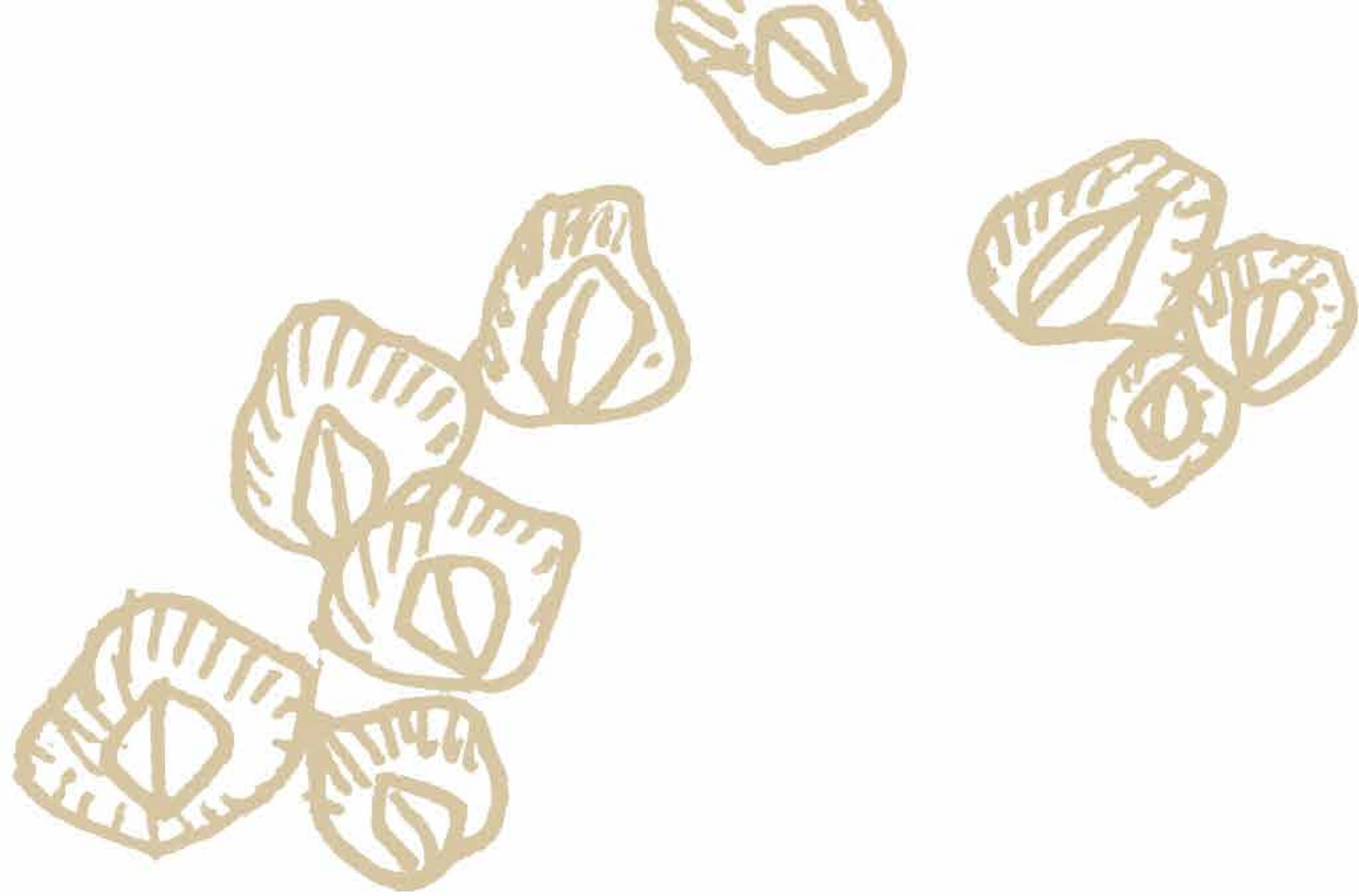

We collect materials for recycling and reuse from residents, businesses, or the street and stop them from polluting the environment.

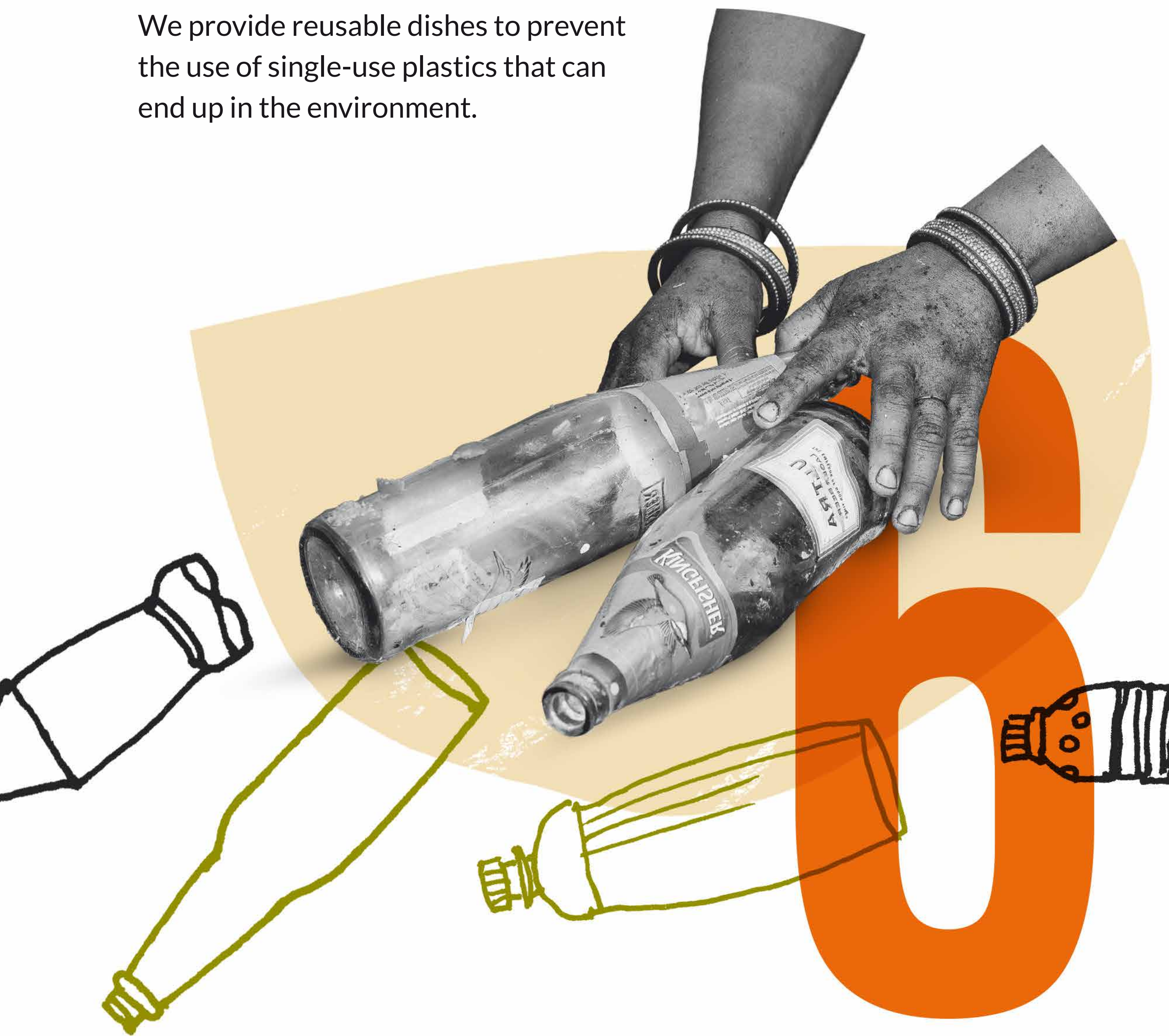
